As a recipient of the first-ever New Docta Fellowship, pianist Audrey Vardanega will also participate in all New Docta activities. A graduate of Columbia University and Mannes School of Music as well as an accomplished international performer, the young California native looks forward to her first trip to Argentina to absorb the inner workings of the festival with a view to recreating similar efforts in her developing career.

New Docta is eager to continue its "Schools to the Theater!" program, which partners with the Ministries of Education in Córdoba and Buenos Aires to bring thousands of children ages 5-8 to the concert hall for a specially designed interactive performance that makes learning about music fun. Hearing the children laugh and scream with joy is one of our greatest pleasures! We also return to check in with our budding musician friends at Orquesta Violeta Parra and La Orquesta-Escuela Mediterranea and provide 30 hours of workshops and master classes for aspiring talents in coordination with the National and Provincial Universities and Conservatories, as well as music institutes.

Realizing that not everyone can come to the concert hall to take in the joys of live music, New Docta is keen to further develop its community engagement in Córdoba and expand it in Buenos Aires. The festival continues its wildly popular "Music and Sports" series in collaboration with the youth academies of some of the most beloved professional sports clubs of Argentina. These boisterous and festive events feature live, interactive performances that spotlight the perseverance, teamwork, and creativity needed to succeed in both disciplines

The New Docta Artists also return to the Garrahan Hospital in Buenos Aires and the Children's Hospital of the Holy Trinity in Córdoba, where we hope our music can soothe the pains and brighten the days of those brave children in need of love, care, and hope.

We cannot thank you enough for your interest in New Docta. We know that many of you come from all across Argentina, South America, and the U.S. to enjoy the abundance of activities that our festival provides, all free of charge and open to anyone with open eyes, ears, and heart. SAMI MERDINIA

Co-Founder and Artistic Director

Hailed for his "beautiful sound and exquisite musicality" (La Nación Newspaper), Argentinian violinist **Sami Merdinian** has received worldwide recognition for his outstanding performances as a soloist and chamber musician. Mr. Merdinian has appeared as a soloist with the Montevideo Philharmonic, the Argentinian National Symphony, The Charlemagne Orchestre, the Gagneung Philharmonic in South Korea, Philharmonia of the Nations at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Buenos Aires Philharmonic, Rochester and South Carolina Philharmonics, and the Midland and Duluth Symphonies.

Mr. Merdinian has appeared in the prestigious Concerti di Mezzogiorno at Spoleto Festival in Italy, NY in Chuncheon Festival in South Korea, Ravinia, Aspen, Great Lakes and I Palpiti festivals in the US, and has performed in venues such as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, and Seoul Arts Center, among others.

As a chamber musician, Mr. Merdinian received the First Prize and Gold Medal at the New England International Chamber Music Competition in Boston, and the First Prize at the Victor Elmaleh Concert Artist Guild Competition in New York. Mr. Merdinian is one of the violinists of the string quintet Sybarite5, with whom he has performed recently at Carnegie Hall, the Library of Congress, Lincoln Center, Apple Store, and toured throughout United States, Canada, Asia and South America. Mr. Merdinian has given recitals in the United States, Canada, Europe, South America, the Lebanon, Australia and Asia.



Mr. Merdinian has been a prize winner in several international competitions including a Gold Medal in the XII International Young Solo Instrumentalists Competition in Argentina, and the New Talent Competition in Slovakia organized by the European Radio. He has also received the Rising Star Award by Tiffany & Co., was named Outstanding Artist of the Year by the Argentinian Press, and has been featured on WQXR in New York, "Spiegenzall" live from the Concertgebouw, Argentinian Classical National Station, America's NPR, South Korean's KBS and the BBC.

Also highly sought-after as tango violinist, Mr. Merdinian has performed and recorded with some of the most prominent artists of the genre and has received a Grammy Nomination for "Masters of the Bandoneon" for Best Tango Album. Mr. Merdinian's discography includes recordings for Universal Records, Canary Classics, CAG Records, Green Parrot Records and Bright Shiny Things.

In 2016, Mr. Merdinian was named Honorary Ambassador for the South Korean's city of Chuncheon, for promoting and supporting national and international activities in the fields of policy, tourism, culture, and art.

Mr. Merdinian is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of the New Docta International Music Festival.

Captivating his audiences with a "primer of technical feats" (New York Sun), and his warm, lush tone "that might be described as something akin to rich old wood" (Boston Musical Intelligencer), YVES DHARAMRAJ has earned a worldwide reputation as a dynamic cellist who blends an immaculate command of the instrument with deep musical understanding to express his fresh and elegant interpretations.

As soloist, recitalist, chamber musician, and teaching artist, the Franco-American cellist enjoys a multifaceted career that takes him to the major stages of the United States and abroad, including appearances at Carnegie Hall, and Lincoln Center (New York); the Kennedy Center (DC); Orchestra Hall, Ravinia Festival, and Chicago Cultural Center (Chicago); Disney Hall (LA); National Arts Center (Ottawa); Berliner Festspiele; Téatro Nacional (Dominican Republic); Panama Jazz Festival; and the Thailand National Cultural Center (Bangkok).

A top prize winner in the Ima Hogg, Irving M. Klein, Florida Orchestra, Juilliard, and ASTA competitions, Dharamraj has appeared with the orchestras of Houston, Green Bay, Edmonton, Florida, Dominican Republic, and Juilliard, with which he performed William Schuman's A Song of Orpheus at Avery Fisher Hall as part of the Juilliard School's Centennial Celebration.

Dharamraj explores the rich chamber music repertoire as a founding member of the Moët Trio and has collaborated with artists including Sir Simon Rattle, Itzhak Perlman, Miriam Fried, Christian Tetzlaff, Cho-Liang Lin, Gilbert Kalish, Ralph Kirshbaum, Mischa Dichter, Isabel Leonard, and members of the Emerson, Cleveland, Guarneri, and Orion Quartets.



As an artist also dedicated to the performance of contemporary music, Dharamraj is a founding member of the genre-defying Bohemian Trio and indulges in the avant-garde as the cellist of Ne(x)tworks. He followed his passion for teaching artistry, arts advocacy, and engaging new audiences as a fellow of the Academy, a musical initiative between Carnegie Hall, Juilliard, the Weill Music Institute, and the New York City Department of Education. He continues outreach activities as a member of Decoda, and cofounded New Docta International Music Festival in Cordoba, Argentina in 2013 to mentor and nurture Latin American talent.

Dharamraj was a pupil of Aldo Parisot at Yale University where he graduated cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts in History (Medieval Mediterranean Studies), a Master of Music, and an Artist Diploma. He further studied in Joel Krosnick and Darrett Adkins's studio at the Juilliard School where he earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree. He has also worked with Paul Katz at the New England Conservatory. Dr. Dharamraj taught cello at Juilliard as assistant to Mr. Krosnick from 2006 to 2009. He plays an 1842 Jean-Baptiste Vuillaume cello. In his leisure time, he loves to learn about and taste the great wines of Burgundy and Bordeaux, and is a zealous supporter of the Chicago Cubs, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and Arsenal FC.

Co-Founder and Artistic Director

Acclaimed for her "smoldering stage presence," (The New York Times) her "richly-hued voice" (BBC Music magazine) and how she "brought many to tears" (The New York Times), the New York based American-Argentinean mezzo-soprano Solange Merdinian has garnered an international reputation for her versatility and interpretation as a recitalist, chamber musician, and opera singer in repertoire ranging from baroque to contemporary, folk, tango, cabaret and world music. She is the Co-Founder and Co-Artistic Director of the non-for profit organization, New Docta, and the New Docta Festival in Argentina.

Highlights include critically praised "tour de force" principal role in Maria de Buenos Aires, Opera Tango by Piazzolla; Amor Brujo by de Falla; singing at Madison Square Garden in NYC, representing Argentina with the National Anthem; and French pop debut for the Hollywood movie The Hundred-foot Journey: "My mind is a stranger without you"; and as a special guest performer at the UN General Assembly for India's 70th Independence Day with renown multi award winner composer and singer AR Rahman.

This season she sang the title role of Maria in Piazzolla's Tango Opera Maria de Buenos Aires with the Fort Worth Opera, The Atlanta Opera, as well as a brand new production in the opening season of the new opera house, Teatro del Bicentenario in San Juan, Argentina. She also presented solo recitals and chamber music concerts in, Fort Worth at Kimball Museum, in NYC, Cordoba, Buenos Aires, and London, New York, among other cities. Other recent performances include Soloist with the Portland Baroque Orchestra, Soloist in Amor Brujo by De Falla with the Knoxville Symphony, collaborations as part of the New Docta Ensemble.



In 2015 she finished a four-year world tour with the Philip Glass Ensemble, in the award-winning production of the landmark opera Einstein on the Beach as directed by Robert Wilson, composed by Philip Glass, and choreographed by Lucinda Childs.

In April 2015, she performed as a soloist with the American Chamber Orchestra, she was also invited to sing at the United Nations on April 24 in Commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide. In the summer of 2015 toured Russia and Armenia with the Shushi Armenian Dance Ensemble.

She has also appeared in "Dawn Upshaw and Friends" (Classical Singer Convention) and Dawn Upshaw and Osvaldo Golijov's Composing Song (Zankel Hall at Carnegie).

Solange Merdinian graduated with a Master in Voice and Vocal Performance from Bard College Conservatory and she received her Bachelor of Music degree from The Juilliard School. She is an effective advocate for social, educational, and cultural programs through music. In spring 2019, she will release her debut solo album entitled "Composing Roots" with guitarist Federico Diaz and pianist Pablo Zinger.

SANDEEP DAS



A 2019 Guggenheim Foundation Fellow, Sandeep Das is one of the leading Tabla virtuosos in the world today. Having established himself as India's top Tabla maestro, he has also built a prolific international reputation. He is one of the unique Indian classical musicians who has collaborated, performed with, and composed for major symphony orchestras, string quartets, and jazz musicians with regularly featured concerts at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Hollywood Bowl, Royal Albert Hall and the Concertgebouw, to name a few.

Das has performed at major events such as the 150th annual celebration of the United Nations at the General Assembly Hall in NYC, opening ceremony of the Special Olympics in Shanghai, opening ceremony of the 1st Asia Expo in Kunming, China, World Economic Forum, the BBC Proms, and for visiting dignitaries like the Queen of England, Queen of Thailand, the Pope and various other visiting country heads. His collaboration with Yo-Yo Ma and the Silk Road Ensemble (SRE) for "Sing Me Home" won the 2017 Grammy Award for the Best World Music album. He has had two previous Grammy nominations in 2005 and 2009. In 2017 he received the prestigious Brother Thomas Fellowship and New England Choice Artist of the Year award, and in 2018, he received a Live Arts Boston grant from the Boston Foundation.

Compositions

Das has composed several pieces combining both percussion and melody. His most recent composition, Vaishnavi, was commissioned by the Freer|Sackler and can be heard on display near the statue of Queen Sembiyan Mahadevi in the museum gallery. Soul Mitra was made possible by an LAB grant and recently premiered at Cal Arts and in Boston, and King Ashoka (2016) was premiered at UC Santa Barbara by Yo-Yo Ma and the SRE and subsequently toured in Asia. Tarang was chosen as the theme music for "Blind Sight," a documentary about the first Everest climb by six blind climbers, and Mohini became the theme music for the Japanese TV channel NHK's 10-episode documentary on the Silk Road. Srishti, a percussive rich composition, has extensively toured worldwide, and in 2008 it was performed at the United Nations General Assembly Hall for the annual United Nations Day Concert.



HUM Ensemble

Das is the founder of HUM (H)armony and (U)niversality through (M)usic. HUM's mission is two-fold: to promote global understanding through performance and education, and to provide learning opportunities and scholarships for specially-abled children with potential in any genre of art to empower them to lead self reliant lives. Since its inception, HUM has grown in size and now supports six specially-abled children through a National Scholarship, the first of its kind in India. The HUM Ensemble is the branch of HUM that creates and tours World Music in innovative combinations and instrumentations.

Heritage

Das had intensively trained for 12 years, starting at the age of 7 in the centuries-old Indian tradition, the Guru-Shishya Parampara, by living with his Guru—Pandit Kishan Maharaj— and learning and practicing music as a way of life, rather than an isolated art form. His training and life experiences provide a unique, educational opportunity for students and ensembles to learn from. He has been on faculty for the last five years at the Harvard Education School Summer Institute and has been an artist in residence at various universities like Dartmouth, Brandeis, UC Santa Barbara, UC Santa Clara, College of the Holy Cross, Juilliard school of Music, Berklee School of Music, and UC British Columbia.

A Gold Medalist in English Literature from Banaras Hindu University in India, he is an artist, performer, composer, and cultural and educational entrepreneur. He currently resides in Boston, USA.

Vasko Dukovski, is a New York based multidisciplinary performing artist and composer. Trained at the prestigious Juilliard School, Dukovski sees no boundaries in music and musical styles, but embraces all of it. Dukovski has collaborated with some of today's leading composers such as Jonathan Dawe, Michael Hersch, Du Yun, Wang Lu, Richard Carrick, Gerald Cohen, Raphael Cendo, Nina Young, Iancu Dumitrescu, Alex Mincek, Kate Soper, John Corigliano, Eric Wubbles, Ricardo Romaneiro, John Adams, Gunther Schuller, Yehudy Weiner, Georg Friedrich Hass, Helmut Lachenmann, Philippe Hurel, George Lewis, Peter Kotik, and many others. In the past decade, Dukovski has commissioned/inspired a number of new works and premiered over three hundred new compositions. An avid performer-composer and advocate of contemporary classical and experimental music, Dukovski regularly performs with some of New York's most respected ensembles including ICE -International Contemporary Ensemble, Argento New Music Project, S.E.M Ensemble, Bang on A Can All Stars, Talea Ensemble, Wet Ink, ECCE-East Coast Contemporary Ensemble, Metropolis Ensemble, Ensemble Pamplemousse, Mise-En Ensemble, Mimesis Ensemble, Nunc Ensemble, AXIOM, LPR Ensemble, The Knights Orchestra and others. In addition of being a front man of his world music quartet Tavche Gravche, he is a member of Either/OR Ensemble, Lost Dog Ensemble, Echappe Ensemble, Unanimity Sound Collective and MarKovStein Principle.

Dukovski's musical sophistication spans the continents, appearing in Europe, The Middle East, North Africa, China, extensively in the US and on regular basis in New York City in venues such as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Symphony Space, Jazz at Lincoln Center, BAM, Roulette, Spectrum, LPR, Miller Theater at Columbia University, The Italian Academy, The Academy of Arts and Letters, The Met Museum and MOMA to name a few.

As a soloist, Dukovski made his New York debut with the New Juilliard Ensemble in 2006 and since then he has appeared with the Macedonian Philharmonic on multiple occasions including a Carnegie Hall Concert. In 2016 Dukovski appeared as a soloist with Ensemble LPR at the historic Naumburg Bandshell at New York's Central Park performing Aaron Copland's masterful Clarinet Concerto to a standing ovation. Mise-En Ensemble featured Dukovski as a soloist for two American premieres of Michael Jarrell's - Essaim Cribles a Bass



Clarinet/Contra Bass Clarinet Concerto as well Eclipse by Yan Marezs. In 2018 Dukovski appeared as a soloist with Échappé Ensemble giving the world premiere of Jonathan Dawe's Astounding Angels.

In 2015 Dukovski was awarded "40 under 40 Successful Macedonians" by the United Macedonian Diaspora. A Nominee of the 2013 "Virtuosi" Award Ceremony in his native Macedonia, Dukovski is a Winner of the 2010 Arriaga Chamber Music Competition with Grneta Ensemble; III Prize Winner of the Andreas Makris Clarinet Competition in Fort Collins, Colorado; Special Prize Winner of the 2002 Jeunnese Musicales Clarinet Competition in Bucharest, Romania; Winner of the 2001 International Woodwind Competition in Stara Zagora, Bulgaria; 2003 Eubie Blake Honors Award recipient; and a II Prize Winner of the 2002 National Chamber Music Competition and 1996 National Clarinet Competition, both in his native Macedonia.

Dukovski's TV and Radio appearances began from an early age at his town's local TV and Radio stations and since then he has appeared on WQXR-NPR, QKCR, The Jack Prize Radio Show, TRT (Turkey) , Brazilian National TV Station, Tunisian National TV Station, China's National TV Station and Tian Jin TV Station.

Dukovski has recorded for Naxos - American Classics, Deutsche Grammophon, New World Records, Albany Records, Sono Luminus - Dorian, Tzadik, Chicken Madness, In a Circle Records, Evolver Records, Furious Artisans, INNOVA Recordings, Non Such and Parma Recordings.

Born in Ohrid, in the Republic of North Macedonia, Dukovski began playing with sound at age five and started his musical education at the age of eight. His dedication to music and the clarinet earned him a Fine Arts Award from the Interlochen Arts Academy, which he attended before earning a Bachelors and a Masters Degree from The Juilliard Schools of Music as a student of Charles Neidich and Ayako Oshima.
